Monthly Message From Rabbi Bahar

As we enter into February, we celebrate two holidays – one Jewish and the other secular, yet both are related to one another. The Jewish holiday is TuBishvat – the birthday of the trees. The secular holiday is Valentines Day, a holiday about love for one another.

In essence though, these holidays are about how we relate to one another and the planet we live on. Specifically, how that relationship is expressed through the love and affection we demonstrate to each other and the Earth

In his work, The Lonely Man of Faith, Rabbi Joseph Soloveitchik, used the two different accounts of creation in Genesis to signify the relationship between humanity and each other. In the first version of creation, God is referred to as Elohim, in the second Adonai In the first version – Elohim creates the system of creation simply through God's words.

In the second, Adonai is active in the creation of humanity. 1 In the first He creates the category of humanity and in the second He creates the individual. In the first comes the sin of eating the forbidden fruit with the consequence of exile from Eden; whereas the second Adonai created garments for the couple emphasizing their dignity.

In Genesis 1, Elohim brings forth the universe, in Genesis 2, He stewards it. The stories combined express the concept that it is not enough for God to simply create;

God provides dignity for humanity by offering them the opportunity to function God-like by becoming a steward of the Earth. But God also realizes that what differentiates us from the Divine is that we cannot function as stewards alone. "It is not good for the Human to be alone; I will make a fitting counterpart for him." (Genesis 2:18) Rabbi Soloveitchik describes the differences between Genesis 1 and 2 as two aspects of humanity – Majestic man and Covenantal man. In Genesis 1, we are majestic creatures of creation, yet we seek connection and experience loneliness.

In Genesis 2 humanity becomes individuals when Adonai creates Adam and his partner – Eve. The emphasis here is not to see humanity as a category, rather to see everyone as individuals Divine helpers.

By exploring these stories as two parts of a necessary whole, we learn that God is demanding that we care both about the relationship between one another and the relationship we have with the Earth. God took the time to both create the world with humans in it and then created the relationship between Adam and Eve. Once that relationship was formed, we left the Garden of Eden where we became God-like and given the task of caring for the world around us by being in relationship with it and one another.

As we celebrate TuBishvat and Valentines Day this year, may we remember the value of love and care for one another and the world around as a sacred obligation.
