I think it used to be fun bumper stickers that we would speak about: "Do random acts of kindness" and other fun sayings. Now that has moved on to include "memes" and "NFTs." What is a "meme"? Merriam-Webster defines "meme" as "an idea, behavior, style, or usage that spreads from person to person within a culture." An "NFT" is a "Non-Fungible Token" which stores on a blockchain, data associated with photos, audio or media.

I think it is easy for us to allow ourselves to be inundated by these messages. Some of these messages are uplifting, while others remind us that we are polarized, separated, and different from one another. There is a famous saying from the Buddist tradition that "Holding a grudge is like drinking poison and waiting for the other person to die."

Poison is not something that is necessarily consumed only once. Even some amount of poison, when continuously consumed, can have devastating consequences. Yet I think this quote is not just about grudges which we feed with poison. It is other items, other ideas we also feed within ourselves which can also cause us harm. It is other thoughts we have which can hurt us: sometimes, ideas from things which happened to us when we were children; some ideas which are simply our biggest fears; some ideas are feelings of why we struggle in our lives.

Sometimes, we may not even realize we are absorbing poison. Poison can be in the form of messages we feed ourselves mindlessly. It can occur when we watch ourselves watching negativity on TV, our Facebook feeds, or our social media. When we do it without realizing what we are doing, we are consuming poison. We give ourselves permission to be negative about the gifts in the world. We subconsciously allow that anger to ooze into our conscious and subconscious minds.


The power we have is that we can choose to focus on positive images. We can be selective when we surround ourselves with images, sayings, and stories which are uplifting. We can live a mindful life and include in that mindfulness what we choose to feed ourselves. One of the gifts we choose is the ability to focus on kindness.

We can get bogged down in negative thoughts, ideas, and often look out at the world and believe that it is only negative. We can often see challenges, which can be overwhelming, making it hard to have the ability to see the good. It is in focusing on positive things which can allow us to see the beauty and the bigger picture.

We read in *Sfer Maalot Hamiddot:* "For the Lord said: 'The world will be built with lovingkindness'" (*Ps.* 89:3). Building on this quote from the Book of Psalms, Yehiel b. Yekutiel says: "If one does lovingkindness with a friend, it is accounted to him as if he built the world."

Building from this, if we fill our lives with images, friends, and opportunities of engagement with lovingkindness, then we not only build our personal world with lovingkindness, but we support the lives of others with lovingkindness.

This calls to mind the old Cherokee tale, *The Two Wolves*, which encapsulates these ideas in a parable:






